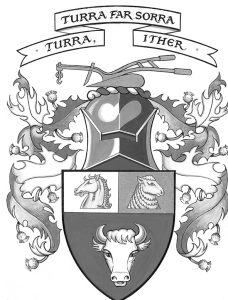

All Exhibits must be staged in the Industrial Section of the Marquee on Sunday, 1st AUGUST from 7.00 am until 9.45 a.m.

Intending Exhibitors are particularly requested to read carefully the Rules of the Exhibition detailed in this Prize List.

RULES

1. The Exhibition is open to all comers.
2. All Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor in whose name the Entry is made and must have been worked since 1st August 2009.
3. No intending Exhibitor may make more than one entry in any class.
4. All Entries must be made to the Secretary of the Agricultural Association on the appropriate Entry Form, supplied for the purpose, which must reach the Secretary not later than SATURDAY, 10th JULY, 2010.
5. All Exhibits must be delivered to the Committee of Management within the Marquee in the Showfield from 7.00 a.m. until 9.45 a.m. on SUNDAY, 1st AUGUST. Where Exhibitors find it impossible or inconvenient to deliver Exhibits personally, such Exhibits will be carefully attended to if forwarded addressed to the Secretary of the Association to be in his hands not later than 9.45 a.m. on SUNDAY, 1st AUGUST, and will be returned to their respective owners after the Show.
6. While every care will be taken of Exhibits, such shall be entirely at the Exhibitor's own risk. The Association shall not be liable for any loss or damage Exhibits may sustain at the Show or in transit.
7. Judging shall commence at 10.00 a.m. on SUNDAY, 1st AUGUST. Exhibits shall be removed between 5.00 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on MONDAY, 2nd AUGUST.
8. In Points Competition a First Prize shall be awarded 4 Points; a Second Prize, 3 Points; a Third Prize, 2 Points; and a Fourth Prize, 1 Point.
9. Judges have the right to turn out contents of Jars, Bottles or other Containers, and to cut or break Cakes, etc.
10. No Challenge of Entries, Classification of Exhibits, Awards of the Judges, or any other procedure shall be competent after 1 p.m. of the second day of the Show, and all Challenges, must be lodged with the Secretary in writing before that time along with £5 which shall be forfeited to the Association should it be the opinion of the Committee of Management that the protest was raised on unreasonable grounds. The Committee shall have the power to settle all disputed questions connected with the Exhibition, and against their decision there shall be no appeal.
11. Prize Money will be paid not later than 1st October, 2010. Prize money from the Children's Section can be collected from the secretary's office after 3pm on SUNDAY, 1st AUGUST.
