- 1. Competition is open to All-Comers.
- 2. Flower vases are provided free of charge by the Association. Vases must not be removed from the Marquee.
- 3. No Exhibitor will be allowed to compete with Exhibits which have not been in his or her possession for 2 months previous to the date of the Show; and two persons cannot compete from the same garden in the same class.
- 4. All exhibits must be forwarded free of expense and must be presented within the Horticultural Section Marquee in the Showyard between 7 pm on SATURDAY 29th JULY, and not later than **9.45 am** on SUNDAY 30th JULY, by which hour all staging must be completed. No preliminary entry is necessary.
- 5. Exhibitors must attach securely to each exhibit a SMALL, SEALED ENVELOPE CONTAINING A CARD which must have the following information:
 - · NAME, ADDRESS, POSTCODE of the Exhibitor
 - PLEASE ALSO CONFIRM IF YOU DO NOT INTENT TO COLLECT THE EXHIBIT ON MONDAY AT THE CLOSE OF THE SHOW

ON THE FRONT OF THE ENVELOPE please write the CLASS NUMBER and the DESCRIPTION OF THE EXHIBIT eg "Class 10, 1 Petunia double'

In Children's Section please state age on outside of envelope.

- 6. The arrangement of Exhibits on the tables shall be wholly under control of a Committee appointed by the Association.
- 7. While every care will be taken of Exhibits, such shall be entirely at the Exhibitors' own risk. Exhibitors will be solely responsible for delivery and removal of their own Exhibits. The Association shall not be liable for any loss or damage which Exhibits may sustain at the show or in transit.
- 8. Judging shall commence at 10.15 am on SUNDAY 30th JULY. No Exhibit shall be removed before 5 pm on MONDAY 31st JULY.

9. An Exhibitor may show a maximum of two entries per class.

- 10. In Points Competitions, a First Prize shall count 3 Points; a Second Prize, 2 Points; and a Third Prize, 1 Point.
- 11. No challenge of entries, classification of exhibits, awards of the judges nor any other procedure shall be competent after 1 pm on MONDAY 31st JULY 2023, and all challenges must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before that time, along with £10, which shall be forfeited to the Association should it be the opinion of the Committee of Management that the protest was raised on unreasonable grounds. The Committee shall have the power to settle all disputed questions connected with the exhibition and against their decision there shall be no appeal.
