3. No Exhibitor will be allowed to compete with Exhibits which have not been in his or her possession for 2 months previous to the date of the Show; and two persons cannot compete from the same garden in the same class.
4. All exhibits must be forwarded free of expense and must be presented within the Horticultural Section Marquee in the Show yard between 7pm on SATURDAY 3rd and no later than 9.45am on SUNDAY 4th AUGUST 2024, by which hour all staging must be completed. No preliminary entry is necessary.
5. Exhibitors must attach securely to each exhibit a **SMALL, SEALED ENVELOPE CONTAINING A CARD** which must have the following information:
 - **NAME, ADDRESS, POSTCODE** of the Exhibitor
 - **PLEASE ALSO CONFIRM IF YOU DO NOT INTEND TO COLLECT THE EXHIBIT ON MONDAY AT THE CLOSE OF THE SHOW**

ON THE FRONT OF THE ENVELOPE please write the **CLASS NUMBER** and the **DESCRIPTION OF THE EXHIBIT** e.g. "Class 10, 1 Petunia double"
IN CHILDREN'S SECTION PLEASE STATE AGE ON OUTSIDE OF ENVELOPE.
6. The arrangement of Exhibits on the tables shall be wholly under control of a Committee appointed by the Association. **DO NOT MOVE EXHIBITS BELONGING TO ANOTHER EXHIBITOR.**
7. While every care will be taken of Exhibits, such shall be entirely at the Exhibitors' own risk. Exhibitors will be solely responsible for delivery and removal of their own Exhibits. The Association shall not be liable for any loss or damage which Exhibits may sustain at the show or in transit.
8. Judging shall commence at 10.15am on SUNDAY 4th AUGUST 2024. No Exhibit shall be removed before 5.00pm. on MONDAY 5th AUGUST. **WE WILL NOT ALLOW VEHICLE ACCESS FOR COLLECTOR OF EXHIBITS BEFORE 5.00PM ON MONDAY 5TH AUGUST 2024 IN THE INTEREST OF HEALTH AND SAFETY.**
9. An Exhibitor may show a maximum of two entries per class.
10. In Points Competition a First Prize shall be awarded 3 Points; a Second Prize, 2 Points; and a Third Prize, 1 Point.
11. No challenge of entries, classification of exhibits, awards of the judges nor any other procedure shall be competent after 1 p.m. on MONDAY 5th August 2024, and all challenges must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before that time, along with £25, which shall be forfeited to the Association should it be the opinion of the Committee of Management that the protest was raised on unreasonable grounds. The Committee shall have the power to settle all disputed questions connected with the exhibition and against their decision there shall be no appeal.
