RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show is open to all.
- 2. An exhibitor may have more than one entry in any Class unless otherwise stated in the Schedule.
- 3. No animal may be entered for or compete in more than one of the Ordinary Classes unless otherwise stated.
- 4. Only stock entered in the Catalogue will be allowed to compete in any of the Classes unless extra special circumstances are deemed to exist.
- All entries must be made to the Secretary on the appropriate entry schedule no later than SATURDAY 14TH JUNE 2025 for all entries. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPROPRIATE FEES AT THE STANDARD RATE PREVAILING AT THE DATE OF RECEIPT OF ENTRY.

There can be no changes made to entries after the closing date.

- 7. The pedigree and ages of all Pedigreed Cattle, Horses and Ponies and Goats must be included with the entry schedule. Please insert the class number and the ear tag number of all cattle entries.
- 8. Once all the entries are made, the Secretary will return an entry schedule to the exhibitor with numbers for each exhibit. PLEASE CHECK THESE CAREFULLY AS THERE WILL BE NO TRANSFERRING OF CLASSES ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW. Exhibitors will be issued with the allocated number of passes for stock attendants and vehicles to allow access to the Showfield, and final instructions.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

Admission to the showground

Entry to the showground is permitted only with a valid Members' Badge or Admission Ticket. Anyone unable to present a ticket must pay the full admission fee for that day, which is non-refundable. During public opening hours, re-entry is allowed with a wristband, which must be obtained from gate staff upon exiting.

Vehicle Access to the Showground

Vehicles will not be admitted to the Showground on show days without an 'Admit to Showfield Pass'. Passes will be issued based on the entries received. If an additional pass is required, please contact the office to discuss your needs.

Admission of Members

TDAA membership is available at an annual fee of £40 per person. Each fully paid member will receive one badge and a ticket for each day of the show. Please note that both the member's badge and the corresponding ticket MUST be presented together to gain entry to the show.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Subject to the Memorandum and Articles of Association the annual membership fee of £40 is <u>due by 30th June each year</u>.
- No memberships can be made on the days of the show.
- Exhibitor membership fee must be paid along with entries.

Admission of Exhibitors

Admission tickets will be sent to Exhibitors along with their competition numbers. Please note that Stock Exhibitor wristbands do not grant admission into the Show. They only indicate authorisation to access the stock lines.

Admission of the Public

The Showground will be open for admission of the public during the following hours:

Sunday from 7.00am – 8.00pm Monday from 7.00am – 6.00pm

LIVESTOCK

- All cattle, sheep, goats, collie dogs, fur and feather shown must have been the absolute property of the Exhibitor for one month prior to the Show and the owner must give satisfactory evidence of the age and other requisites of the animal to be allowed to compete.
- Livestock entering the Showfield for exhibition on the Monday should not arrive before 7.00pm on the Sunday unless prior permission is sought from the Show Secretary.
- 3. All animals entered for exhibition must remain in the Showfield until 3.00pm on the afternoon of the Show.
- 4. Scottish animals moving to Turriff Show for exhibition for the first time will not have to be kept separate prior to moving to the Show irrespective of whether any other livestock have been moved on to those premises in the 13-day period immediately before moving. If attending only one Show within any one 13-day period the animal will not require to be held separate on return from the Show nor will the

return home trigger a 13-day standstill for any other animal on the home farm. Also animals may move from Show to Show or may return to their usual premise of residence without triggering a 13-day standstill provided they are kept in separate facilities under an approved separation agreement with the Scottish Government Rural Directorate.

The transit of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland)
Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from the
Show. Please ensure that all vehicles, including hauliers' transportation
are thoroughly clean.

HORSES & PONIES

- All equines must be accompanied by a passport which may be inspected
 by an appointed official and for all animals born, or passports issued, on
 or after 1st July 2009 to be fitted with a microchip as per the Horse
 Identification (Scotland) Regulations 2009.
- It is strongly advised that all equines wishing to compete are properly vaccinated against Equine Influenza. Please consult with your own veterinary practise regarding correct vaccination process. This rule is subject to change.
- 3. Horse or pony exhibitors cannot show any animal that has been bred, leased, sold or on loan from the Judge.
- 4. If the horse or pony exhibitor does not own the animal then full details of the owner's name and address must be provided with the entry.
- HATS

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 & 2023, SNELL E2016 & E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, **MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted**. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green.

CATTLE

- 1. All cattle for exhibition must comply with current Scottish Government Rural Directorate regulations.
- Cows of all Beef Breeds, other than the British Blue breed, whether or not having at some time been subject to ovum transfer or a flushing programme, must have given birth to a live or full-term calf on or after 1st August 2024 and before the day of the Show.
- Beef Shorthorn and Aberdeen Angus two-year-old heifers must be in calf or have had a calf when exhibited.
- 4. Pure-bred bullocks and pure unregistered heifers may compete in the Commercial Cattle Section.
- 5. All cattle must be led in the Judging Rings.
- 6. Cattle must be ear tagged in accordance with Scottish Government Rural Directorate guidance.
- 7. All Carcase cattle must be Farm Assured.

- 8. Cattle moving to and from the Show must have their movements notified to ScotEID.
 - WHEN AN ANIMAL MOVES TO AND FROM THE SHOWGROUND YOU NEED TO DO THE FOLLOWING:
- REPORT A MOVEMENT 'OFF' YOUR HOLDING
- A MEMBER OF THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL UPDATE YOUR ON AND OFF MOVEMENT ON YOUR ANIMALS FROM THE COMPLETED "EAR TAG DECLARATION FORM" WHICH WILL BE SENT TO YOU WITH YOUR EXHIBITOR NUMBERS – PLEASE ENSURE THIS IS DONE PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF JUDGING.
- REPORT THE MOVEMENT BACK ON TO YOUR HOLDING
- YOU MUST FILL IN THE MOVEMENT SUMMARY SECTION ON THE PASSPORT FOR YOUR 'OFF' AND 'ON' MOVEMENT.

All registered cattle keepers can report movements using ScotEID at www.scoteid.com instead of using the movement cards within 3 days of the movement taking place.

For each animal taken to the Showground you must have one of the following documents:

- a chequebook style passport (CPP13)
- a certificate of registration (CHR3)
- a certificate of registration and a blue/green passport (CPP1)
- a new single page passport (CPP52)

For animals with certificates of registration fill in the movement card in the same way as a chequebook style passport (CPP13).

If the animal has a certificate of registration and a blue/green passport, the movements' summary section on the passport must also be filled in. If the passport movement summary is full, a continuation sheet should be attached. All calves must also have a cattle passport.

Turriff Show labels with the **Showfield CPH number 66/083/8020**, will be issued at the Show on receipt of the completed "Ear Tag Declaration".

 In the event of new Animal Health Legislation being enacted between the date of preparation of this Schedule and the date of the Show Exhibitors will be expected to abide by any new conditions of that legislation.

Notifiable Disease

Any animal which shows signs suggestive of a notifiable disease, e.g. FMD, BSE must be reported to the Society's Official Duty Veterinary Surgeons or Official Convenors. All requests and instructions by the Official Duty Veterinary Surgeons, Convenors concerning the suspected animal(s) must be complied with.

Bovine Tuberculosis

Any exhibitor bringing cattle to the Show from outwith Scotland must in the previous 30 days from the Show have obtained a negative TB result on all the cattle being brought to the Show.

Bovine Viral Diarrhoea

All cattle (including calves) coming to the Show must come from a Scottish holding with 'negative' herd status for BVD, from a herd that is fully accredited free of BVD or they must all be individually tested free of virus (antigen) whether or not they have been vaccinated, in accordance with CHeCS rules (www.checs.co.uk).

SHEEP & GOATS

- Sheep and goats including lambs must be individually identified in accordance with current Scottish Government Rural Directorate guidance. Spot checks that reveal any sheep or goats not complying may be spray-marked after judging. The Area Office may issue a warning letter and on-farm checks may follow.
- 2. All Butchers Lambs must be Farm Assured.
- 3. The Exhibitor must complete a separate Movement Document for the journey to and from the showground. This should include your full CPH number and the Showfield CPH number 66/083/8020. The need to individually record tag numbers on the Movement Document has been removed. Do not surrender the document to show organisers.
- The Movement Document should be available for inspection by Scottish Government Rural Directorate/Local Authority staff upon request. If you are unsure of the action required, please contact your local area office or SAMU (Tel: 0845 601 7597).
- Within 3 days of returning home, the exhibitor/keeper must notify the Scottish Animal Movement Unit (SAMU) of the move by e-mail, fax or post.

6. Maedi Visna/Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis Accreditation Scheme. Exhibitors, please ensure you bring correct certificate of status (current valid SAC Scheme form or Health Status Report, signed, dated with destination and ear numbers of animals completed in full by exhibitor). Please have this paperwork ready for inspection by sheep/goat convenors on approach to the sheep/goat penning areas. Accredited animals will not be permitted to unload without it.

- Please use the separate unloading and re-loading points for MV/CAE
 Accredited and Non-Accredited stock in the showfield. MV/CAE
 Accredited and Non-Accredited stock must not come into contact at
 any time during the Show.
- 8. Attendants on sheep are required to wear white coats while leading animals in the judging rings.

POULTRY

There are no Poultry classes scheduled.

RABBITS, CAVIES & PIGEONS

- 1. Animals must not be boxed until 3.30pm unless authorised by convenor.
- RABBITS ONLY It is planned to hold classes for the above bearing in mind that any development of VHD could result in Cancellation. The British Rabbit Council will advise on Correct Procedure.
- 3. **PIGEONS ONLY** No person is allowed to leave the Marquee when boxing up until all exhibitors have basketed their pigeons.

PARADE

 All 1st-4th prize winners in the Horse and Pony, Cattle, Goat and Collie Dog Sections should have their animals ready to parade at the appointed time. Horses, Ponies, Donkeys and Goats should be ready to parade at 2.15pm on the Sunday and Clydesdale Horses, Cattle and Collie Dogs at 2.00pm on the Monday.

Failure to do so may result in prize money and prizes being forfeited. Please display prizes, rosettes, and numbers prominently on the near side (left hand side looking from the rear) of the animal.

JUDGING

- Horses and Ponies (except Clydesdale Horses), Goats, Rabbits, Cavies and Pigeons are judged on Sunday 3rd August 2025.
- Clydesdale Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Eggs are judged on Monday 4th August 2025.
- 3. All animals must be penned in the Show yard by 7.30am for judging to commence promptly as per Judging Timetable.
- Judges are empowered to award prizes even though there should only be one entry.
- Where more than one Judge is used to award a Special Prize or Championship, each Judge will decide which exhibits, having already come before them, shall be brought forward.
- 6. If the Overall Judge has an interest in any of the Section Champions, they will judge the remaining animals and another Judge will be appointed on the day to slot the animal(s) in question in the overall line up.





PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU PROVIDE BANK DETAILS TO THE TEAM AT entries@turriffshow.org IF YOU ARE PLACED AND SHOULD RECEIVE PRIZE MONEY. In the event of bank details not being provided to the Association BY 1ST NOVEMBER 2025 prize money will be retained as a donation.
- 5. All Trophies and Presidents Prizes won at the Show will be presented to winning exhibitors at the Annual Dinner and Presentation of Prizes due to be held in the Banff Springs Hotel, Banff on Friday 31st October 2025. If you are unable to collect your trophy at the Annual Dinner and Presentation of Prizes please contact the office to make arrangements to collect at a convenient time. Those trophies not collected by 1st December will be retained and stored and will not be available for collection.

GENERAL

- All exhibitors and stock attendants should remain with the animals in their charge, adhere to Health and Safety Regulations ensuring that neither they nor anyone else are put at risk and conform to directions of Show officials whilst in the Showground.
- 2. TDAA shall not be liable for any loss or damage that exhibits may sustain at the Show or in movement to or from the Show.
- 3. No challenge of entries, classification of stock, awards made by Judges, or any other procedure shall be competent after 1.30pm on the day of the Show. All challenges must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before that time, along with £25, which shall be forfeited by TDAA should it be the opinion of the Directors that the protest was raised on unreasonable grounds. The Directors and subsequently the Committee shall have the power to settle all disputed questions connected with the affairs of TDAA and against their decision there shall be no appeal.
- 4. Should there be limited or no entries in any class, the Committee will have the power to delete or replace the class.

43. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PASO15 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.

BODY PROTECTORS

50. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes, Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

Air Jackets may be worn. If a member chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings.

When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise can startle horses, thereby, causing difficulties for other members if used in confined areas, eg, indoor schools and ménage's. Therefore, air jackets are not encouraged to be used in those areas except for medical reasons.

No SPURS and please read the BSPS Rule 52 on the appropriate use of a WHIP.

If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.

Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

Turriff Show is affiliated to the **British Driving Society**. Points are awarded for the highest placed turnouts driven by a BDS member and count towards the Whitehall Cup and the Chairman's Cup.

RULFS

Young Drivers:

The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over, a "responsible adult". Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 8 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground.

Hard Hats:

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.
